Her work, especially in heritage language pedagogy and Open Educational Resources (OER) fosters Diversity, Equity, Inclusivity, and Belonging (DEIB) in language teaching. She is a recipient of the 2024 MAFLT LCTL Innovation Award, honored for her innovative use of technology in teaching Less Commonly Taught Languages (LCTLs). Her experience includes teaching at the University of Texas, Austin, and participating in various panels and workshops on online instruction and inclusivity. With a Ph.D. in Linguistics from the University of Delhi, Dr. Bajaj's research interests include heritage language pedagogy, gender and sexuality studies, and project-based language learning.
