EDUCATION CAMP

National Service Scheme (NSS) Unit of Ram Lal Anand College, University of Delhi, conducted a transformative five-day education camp from October 07, 2024 to october 11, 2024.





During this impactful period, NSS volunteers dedicated their time and energy to engage with the local community in JJ Colony, a region that often faces educational challenges. The primary objective of the camp was to enhance academic knowledge among the children while simultaneously cultivating essential soft skills such as teamwork, communication, and leadership among both the young learners and the volunteers


The camp was structured to run daily for two hours, from 3 p.m. to 5 p.m., Approximately 20 to 25 volunteers participated in this drive and on an average 30 to 35 children were taught everyday.

















(F) BLS TRAINING SESSION



On October 10, the NSS unit at Ram Lal Anand College, in collaboration with the Indian Spinal Surgeries Centre, conducted a lifesaving Basic Life Support (BLS) Training Session. This event empowered volunteers with critical emergency skills. The training covered essential CPR techniques for adults, children, and infants.









Proper use of Automated External Defibrillators (AED), and methods to address choking incidents in all age groups were also taught. A total of 74 volunteers actively participated, practicing on dummies to gain hands-on experience and boost their readiness for emergencies.

MENTAL HEALTH AWARENESS

On 10th October, 2024, the NSS Unit of Ram Lal Anand College organized a webinar on Mental Health Awareness, led by guest speaker Ritu Nilofer. The session focused on the importance of mental well-being, offering practical strategies for managing stress and anxiety. Ms. Nilofer emphasized breaking tasks into smaller steps to reduce procrastination and highlighted the role of self-compassion in overcoming depression. She also discussed how both introverts and extroverts can leverage their strengths in social settings while emphasizing self-acceptance and growth.







Over 100 volunteers actively participated, asking insightful questions about balancing productivity with mental health and stepping out of their comfort zones. The high engagement level made the event interactive and impactful.

DECLAMATION COMPETITION

On October 16, 2024, the National Service Scheme (NSS) of Ram Lal Anand College, in collaboration with the National Tobacco Control Programme (NTCP), hosted a Declamation Competition to raise awareness about the harmful effects of tobacco use. Held at 12 PM in the seminar room, the event aimed to foster public speaking skills, critical thinking, and advocacy for a tobacco-free society.





Participants addressed topics like second-hand smoking and tobacco addiction, with 12 students showcasing their views on tobacco's impact on public health. Judged by experts, including Dr. Anurag Sharma, winners included Alok Raj (1st), Shresth Mathpal (2nd), and Ankush (3rd), along with three consolation awards. The event was a success, providing a platform for students to voice concerns and advocate for healthier lifestyles while underscoring the significance of collaborative public health efforts.

POSTER MAKING COMPETITION







On October 16, 2024, the NSS unit of Ram Lal Anand College, in collaboration with the National Tobacco Control Programme (NTCP), organized its second event of the day—a poster-making competition at the college amphitheater. The competition aimed to raise awareness about the harmful effects of tobacco and promote a tobacco-free lifestyle. Fifty-three students participated, showcasing their creativity and views on anti-tobacco themes. Judged by experts in public health, tobacco control, and communication, including NSS Program Officer Dr. Anurag Sharma, participants were evaluated on content, clarity, delivery, and impact. Tripti Kumari won the first prize, followed by Aakarsh Maurya and Nishu Birla in second and third places, respectively. Three additional students received consolation prizes for their efforts. The event successfully empowered students as advocates for a healthier society while advancing NTCP's mission.







MOVIE SCREENING








This program not only provided essential items to underprivileged children but also encouraged a spirit of empathy and support among volunteers, motivating everyone to assist those in need.





NATIONAL UNITY DAY
