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Milestone 5.0 Annual Placement and Internship Fair 2025







Dr. Krishan Gopal Tyagi motivated the students by discussing the successes of the alumni of the college and history as a discipline.



मीडिया (इंटरनेट अगर सामाजिक, सोशल पर आधारित जन समूह) की बात करें तो आज कृत्रिम बुद्धि मता आपकी स्वतंत्रता को नकारात्मक रूप से प्रभावित कर रही है। आपकी सोचने और समझने की आजादी पर कुठाराघात है। उदाहरण के लिए सोशल मीडिया आपको धीरे–धीरे उन्हीं समूहों में जोड़ने लगता है जिस तरह के समूह आप पसंद करते हैं। आपको एक दायरे में सीमित कर देता है। आपको सोचना चाहिए कि आप एक दायरे तक सीमित हो गए हैं। कृत्रिम बुद्धिमता में इतनी होशियारी है कि आप यह भी नहीं पहचान सकोगे कि पर्दे के दूसरी तरफ मानव है या कोई मशीन। यह अपने आपको धीरे–धीरे बढ़ा रहा है। अगर पुराने समय की बात करें तो अमीबा से डाइनासोर बनने में कई लाख साल लगे थे। लेकिन कृत्रिम बुद्धिमता का डाइनासोर बनने में कुछ साल ही पर्याप्त हैं। अतः हमें सोचना पड़ेगा कि इस पर कुछ रेगुलेटरी व्यवस्था होनी चाहिए। नहीं तो कृत्रिम बुद्धिमता मानव सभ्यता को निगल जाएगी। अगर मानव सभ्यता को बचाना है तो कृत्रिम बुद्धिमता का दायरा सीमित करना होगा।

संविधान

अपनी इस रचनात्मक लेखन के के प्रारंभ से पहले हम ये जानने का प्रयास करेंगे कि संविधान क्या होता है और इसका क्या अर्थ है। तो संविधान दो शब्दों का मेल है सम+विधान जिसका अर्थ होता है , सम अर्थात समान, विधान अर्थात नियम कानून सभी के लिए, समान नियम कानून के दस्तावेज को संविधान कहते है। संविधान अर्थात नियम कानूनों की एक ऐसी लिखित व अलिखित दस्तावेज का संयोग जिससे किसी देश - प्रांत का शासन चलाया जाता हो उसे संविधान कहते है।

संविधान निर्माण

किसी भी देश या राज्य के संविधान निर्माण की प्रकिया काफी लंबी एवं जटिल होती है, संविधान निर्माण में एक लंबा समय लगता है, ज्ञानी,बुद्धिजीवी, दार्शनिकों एवं बड़े सामाजिक - राजनीतिक लोगों की एक टोली का गठन किया जाता है जिसे संविधान सदस्य(सभा) कहते है। ये सभी लोग जो संविधान सभा के सदस्य होते है, ये अनेकों - अनेक बैठकें, मिलन इत्यादि करते है, हर नियम पर एक पूर्ण बहस एवं चर्चा की जाती है(उदाहरण:- मौलिक दायित्व - अब इस पर

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संविधान सभा में सदस्याओं के मध्य चर्चा होगी कि क्या हम इसकी आवश्यकता है और अगर है तो किन - किन प्रकार के दायित्वों की और कौन कौन से हमे अपनाने चाहिए और की उन सब पर एक गहन चर्चा होगी) ऐसे ही संविधान सभा में कई प्रकार के छोटी -छोटी टोली होती है जैसे भारतीय संविधान सभा की एक टोली थी प्रारूप समिति जिसके अध्यक्ष डॉ बी आर आंबेडकर जी को नियुक्त किया गया जिसका कार्य संविधान का प्रारूप तय करना था। भारतीय संविधान में ऐसे टोलिया थी और सभी टोली हर विषय पर बैठक इत्यादि करते थे। फल स्वरूप भारतीय संविधान को पूर्ण बनने में 2 वर्ष 11 महीने एवं 18 दिन का समय लगा जो कि 26 नवंबर 1949 को बन कर तैयार हुआ। एक ऐतिहासिक दिन को लागू किया गया (26 जनवरी 1950)

यू तो कहते है हर संविधान बना है तो लागू तो होगा ही परंतु भारतीय संविधान जो कि लिखित रूप से विश्व का सबसे बड़ा संविधान हैं जिसमे लगभग 400 से अधिक अनुच्छेद है इसे बनाने में 2 वर्ष 11 महीने एवं 18 दिनों बाद तैयार होने पर 26 जनवरी को लागू किया गया। यह दिन सिर्फ इसलिए नहीं चुना गया कि अगले वर्ष का पहला माह या अन्य कोई कारण बल्कि क्योंकि ये दिन इसलिए चुना गया कियकी ये दिन स्वतंत्रता से पहले स्वराज दिवस के रूप में माना जाता था क्योंकि कांग्रेस अधिवेशन 1930 में यह तय किया गया था कि अब हर 26 जनवरी को भारत वासी स्वराज दिवस के रूप में मनाएंगे ,अब इससे अच्छा दिन क्या हो सकता है कि गणतंत्र घोषित करने के लिए और स्वतंत्र भारत में संविधान लागू करने के लिए।

भारतीय संविधान जो विशेषताओं से भरा है

 सार्व भौमिक वयस्क मताधिकार :- यू तो कहने के लिए यह बहुत देश है जो कहते है हम सार्व भौमिक वयस्क मताधिकार है, परंतु भारत उनसे भिन्न कैसे वो ऐसे की भारत में महिला हो या पुरुष चाहे वो किसी भी लिंग, समाज, जाती, धर्म से आता हो यही वह 18 वर्ष या उससे ऊपर है तो उससे मत देने का पूर्ण अधिकार है।

मौलिक अधिकारी एवं कर्तव्य :- मौलिक कर्तव्य एवं अधिकार

ये भारतीय संविधान की ऐसी विशेषताएं है जो आज के समय भी विश्व के कई देशों के नागरिक इससे वांछित है। भारत में सबको ये पूर्णतः प्राप्त है।

3. प्रस्तावना :- यू तो ये संविधान का अंग है या नहीं है इस पर अनेकों - अनेक फैसले आए है परंतु उन सब के ऊपर ये खास इसलिए है क्योंकि आज के समय जहां या पहले भी लोग ज्यादा साक्षर नहीं होते थे उन्हें संविधान पढ़ने में अकुशलता या समझ में नहीं रहता था वे सभी केवल प्रस्तावना को पढ़ कर ही ये जान सकते है कि भारतीय संविधान की क्या विशेषताएं एवं प्रकृति क्या है।

4. भारतीय संविधान पहले, अब और सदैव :- आज के समय भारतीय संविधान के निर्मित हुए 75 वर्ष हो चुके है, एन 75 वर्षों में संविधान को चुनौतियां मिली, संशोधन हुए कई बार ऐसा लगा कि संविधान खतरे में है लेकिन उन सभी पर अडिंग रहा। यहां कई ऐसे देश है जहां संविधान एक समाज की तरफ झुकाव देखता है, एक धर्म को बढ़ावा देता है। कई देशों के संविधान तो हर दशक में बदले जाते है, कई देशों के संविधान 10 बार बदले जा चुके है, या तो ऐसा होता है कि पहले बने तब वे अनुकूल थे लेकिन बाद में वह प्रतिकूल हो गए सही से कार्य नहीं कर पाए।

मुझे और हम सभी को गर्व होना चाहिए कि हम एक ऐसे देश के नागरिक है जहां का संविधान एक धर्म निरपेक्ष समाज -राष्ट्र को बढ़ावा देता है ,कभी कैसी विशेष समुदाय समाज को बढ़ावा नहीं देता है , यदि कही की को प्रताड़ित किया जा रहा है तो उसकी रक्षा करता है , भारतीय संविधान पहले ,अब एवं सदैव ही समाज के अनुकूल रहा है , ये हमेशा में असामाजिकता - असमानता को रोकता है। हा ये हो सकता है कि 1950 में कुछ कानून ऐसे थे जिन्हें आज बदलना चाहिए जो वे बदले जाएंगे (उदाहरण :- पहले वयस्क मताधिकार की आयु 21 थी जिसे समय के साथ बदल कर 18 कर दिया गया) क्योंकि संविधान न तो ऐसा है कि जब चाहे कुछ भी संशोधित कर दिया जाए और न ही तो इतना जटिल है कि कभी भी कुछ संशोधित न किया जा सके । भारतीय संविधान सदैव से नागरिकों के बीच एक अभिभावक की तरह कार्य कार्य है, लोगों को उनके अधिकारों -दायित्वों का बोध

स्थापित कर रहे हैं, जिसमें भारत अपनी असीम सांस्कृतिक सीमाओं को बढ़ाते हुए आज विश्व पटल पर अपने भाव को प्रकट कर रहा है।

आज के युग में भारत पुनः विश्वगुरु बनने की ओर अग्रसर होता दिखाई देता है, जहाँ भारत ज्ञान के क्षेत्र में एक दीपक के समान विश्व को उज्ज्वल कर रहा है और इस दीपक की दिव्यता हर क्षेत्र में झलकती है, चाहे वह विज्ञान हो, राजनीति हो या अर्थशास्त्र। भारत आज विश्व को दिशा देने की दशा में है।

भारत पुनः अखंडता की ओर बढ़ते हुए पूरे विश्व को एक डोर में बाँधने का प्रयास कर रहा है। यहाँ अखंडता भौगोलिक आधार पर नहीं, बल्कि सांस्कृतिक समदृष्टि के रूप में प्रसारित हो रही है एवं विश्व को अपने मूल्यों से प्रज्वलित कर रही है। जब हम भारत के स्वर्णिम युग को जानते हैं, तो हमें उसका आर्थिक पक्ष ध्यान में आता है, परंतु इसके अलावा विविधता, सामाजिक एकता, समरसता, आध्यात्मिक एवं सांस्कृतिक गुणवत्ता में भी असीम वृद्धि देखने को मिलती है।

भारत आज राष्ट्रपटल पर खुद को उम्मीद की किरण के रूप में अलग-अलग देशों के समक्ष प्रस्तुत कर रहा है। भारत का यही राष्ट्र-विचार, जो भारत के लोगों से उत्पन्न हो रहा है, किसी सीमा से बाध्य न होकर हर सीमा को सांस्कृतिक आधार से जोड़ रहा है। भारत एक ऐसा देश है, जहाँ पर नीतियाँ शास्त्रार्थ एवं लोकतंत्र निर्मित होती आई हैं। यह शास्त्रार्थ से सद्धाव तक की नीतियाँ पुनः देश में अग्रसर होती दिखाई पड़ रही हैं, जहाँ भारत की नीतियाँ कठोर न होकर लचीली और लोकसंगत दिखाई देती हैं।



THE JOURNEY THROUGH A DIARY Punyavee Mohan

Today is a day worth remembering. While rummaging through my grandmother's almirah, I stumbled upon something extraordinary—a collection of letters and an old diary from the late 1800s. How incredible is that! Though time had faded some of the ink, and the pages had grown fragile, the words still carried an essence that even time itself had failed to erase. I have named them "Letters from the Past."

I have no knowledge of the person to whom these writings belonged, except for the name signed at the bottom—Advita. Even my bua couldn't trace anyone by that name in our family history. However, based on the tales she has heard about an ancestor with exquisite handwriting, eloquence, and an expansive vocabulary, she suspects that Advita might have been our great-great-grandmother's pen name—a veil of secrecy worn by a woman who fought against all odds to live life on her own terms.

As I turned the pages, my excitement to read the entire diary grew exponentially. One entry spoke of **Advita's joy upon completing middle school**, further strengthening bua's belief that this woman had defied societal expectations to pursue knowledge. However, as the pages crumbled in my hands, so did the **story of her life**, shifting from joy to sorrow.

One particular entry shook me to my core—the moment Advita witnessed a woman being burned alive by her neighbors simply because she aspired to complete her education. That incident crushed her spirit, and out of fear, her father arranged her marriage to a man eleven years older than her.

The thrill of reading the diary soon gave way to **reflection and grief**. Married at sixteen, she was thrust into a life of duty and expectations, her identity reduced to that of a wife. A tragic proof of the **deeply entrenched patriarchy** was that she never once addressed her husband by his name—a symbol of **unidirectional respect and forced submission**. Was she truly his **ardhangini** (equal half)? Her words in the journal suggest



otherwise.

Her entries became sparse between 1890 and 1897, hinting at years of silent suffering. She only wrote about extremes—utmost sorrow and fleeting joys. During this period, she bore two children—one who died just three days after birth from an undiagnosed fever, and another, Mohan, who at least survived long enough to be remembered in her journal.

Her words painted a vivid picture of her life, an animation unfolding before my eyes. But among all the pages, one entry captivated me the most—the moment where her story took a turn, the moment she reclaimed her power.

March 21st, 1897 | 7 PM

My Dearest Friend,

Oh, my dear journal! Would you believe all that has happened since my last entry, when Gangadhar hit me? Mohan cried the entire night after witnessing it—blood dripping from my nose, my face sunken and aching.

That night, through his sobs, my little Mohan whispered something that changed my life: *"Take me with you, Maa. Leave him. Leave him for good."*

The next morning, before Mohan could wake up, I confronted Gangadhar. I braced myself for another blow, expecting history to repeat itself. But to my shock, **he broke down in tears.** It was the first time I had ever seen a grown man cry, and it felt surreal.

Moment by moment, he began **peeling away the layers of his silence**—until he finally revealed the truth.

He had lost his job to British officers who favored their own. Stripped of his livelihood, he had been working as a clinic cleaner for a week, too ashamed to tell me. He apologized, not just for his secrecy, but for the years of pain he had inflicted upon me. He swore never to raise his hand or voice at me again. For the first time, he realized that **the home he had built for his son should not be a house of abuse.**

I know his words do not erase his past actions, but his remorse gave me relief. I wanted to believe him—and I am glad I did. But just as life seemed to shift in my favor, a storm was brewing.

Three days later, a fever struck both my child and my husband.

A storm shook my life...

Fever struck the child and the man, The last one standing was the wife. Ran out of savings and valuables, Disease progressed as they grew frailer, Who would care when isolation was the law? Who would now be the sole breadwinner? The tonics gave a flicker of hope, But recovery was nowhere in sight. All that remained was me and my knowledge, Would I be able to paint the future bright? Said the man—*"Find a job, my love! Your strength easily surpasses mine."* Thus began my journey of **freedom and his change**,

My earnings, my career took a form divine. Recovered by my son and husband...

Did I have to stop and stay back?

His admiration for me grew wings,

Said—"I won't be a hurdle; freedom mustn't lack!"

He is a changed man, my diary! The transformation was slow, but it was real. Or perhaps, surreal. And I? Unchanged and untamed...

Yours, Advita

That final line sent shivers down my spine. Do you see it? For the first time, she addressed him by his name. He had earned his place in her heart—not through force, but through change. But this isn't just Advita's story—this is the story of countless women, past and present. This entry is a reminder of how far women have come, yet how far we still have to go.

What differentiates Advita from the countless women facing oppression today? Courage. A companion who recognized his mistakes. A woman who chose to reclaim her power.

I seek her strength. For I never know when I, too, might need it someday.

No wonder this diary survived the test of time—both literally and figuratively.

THE STRENGTH AND STRUGGLE OF WOMANHOOD

She carries the burden of physical and emotional hardships, including the unimaginable pain of pregnancy and childbirth, often compared to the pain of being stung by thousands of scorpions.

Since ancient times, life has never been easy for women. In a male-dominated society, women have been marginalized, oppressed, and objectified. मध्यकाल में नारी



Corporate Social Responsibility: A Mask Against Environmental Degradation

The proponents of neo-classical economics believed that the primary social obligation of businesses is to be profitable, as long as it is done ethically and within the boundaries of the law. Milton Friedman, along with other supporters of the 'shareholder model,' including other neo-classical economists and Nobel Prize winners, believe that companies are not accountable for the well-being of society. In 1982, Donaldson states that a tacit social agreement exists between businesses and society, which entails certain indirect responsibilities of businesses towards society. The sole social responsibility of a business is to utilize its resources and participate in activities that aim to boost its profits while operating within the boundaries of fair competition, avoiding deceit or fraud. Scholars have raised doubts about the shareholder model. Bowen proposed that business people have social responsibilities beyond just seeking profits. He was among the pioneering authors to try and establish a definition of CSR. Based on Bowen's perspective, CSR pertains to the policies, decisions, and actions that are in line with the objectives and beliefs of society. In this way, businesses generate wealth in the



community, raise its quality of life, and still make a decent profit.

When we examine e-Choupal, a project created by ITC, exemplifies successful CSR initiatives. ITC Group is a substantial company with a wide range of investments in tobacco, the hospitality industry, and increasingly in consumer goods. The IBD department within the ITC Group handles the sourcing, handling, and shipment of agricultural products such as soybean, wheat, shrimp, and coffee. In recent years, ITC-IBD developed an IT-based rural network (named e-Choupal) reaching 2500 villages now. The channel has generated significant social impact by enabling Internet access and global business interaction in a region previously hindered by infrastructural, economic, and social barriers. The e-Choupal model demonstrates how a large corporation can assist in discovering markets and enhancing the effectiveness of an agricultural system, all while positively impacting farmers, rural communities, and shareholders. The case shows how technology, supplied and serviced by a company, plays a crucial role in promoting transparency, enhancing information availability, and changing rural areas, as evidenced by its use by local farmers. Main reasons why the business enterprise is seen as successful are ITC's extensive knowledge of farming, their commitment to keeping a large part of the current production process intact by collaborating closely with local partners, their focus on transparency, and their equitable treatment of farmers and local partners. In the past ten years, corporate social responsibility

and sustainability have become a key focus

for global businesses, with more companies participating in responsible and sustainable practices to generate both social and business benefits. Despite Nike's sweatshop crisis in the 1990s and Walmart's ethical controversies in the mid-2000s, as well as BP's Deepwater Horizon oil spill in 2010 and Volkswagen's emissions scandal in 2015, it is evident that every few years there is a major corporate ethical scandal that garners media attention and diminishes the public's trust in corporations and their social responsibility. Volkswagen pretended to care and only focusing on the outer appearance of sustainability will not bring any real benefits to the company or society. As we have observed, it definitely results in substantial expenses. Studies indicate that incorporating social responsibility and sustainability into the company's culture and core business strategies generates business value. If executed correctly, companies can enjoy a better corporate image, increased customer loyalty, improved employee morale, and strengthened organizational learning and core competence.

Evaluating something based on its utility is typically the most effective approach. When discussing CSR, there are two possible scenarios: one where companies engage in it because they are required to, and another where they do so willingly. In both scenarios, the resource is being directed towards the welfare program, aiding in the achievement of collective welfare goals. Genuine concern for society ultimately benefits the company in the long term by blending socialism and capitalism.

Environment - Protection of Its Beauty and Rising Concerns

The environment is not just a subject we study in books but also its the essence that has the foundation of our today's life. Especially, the land we are breathing on—India – home to the most unique breath-taking landscapes, from the towering Himalayas to the lush Western Ghats. Being one of the 17 megadiverse countries of the world, India has over 45,000 plant species





and over 100,000 animal species which is nearly 7-8% of global biodiversity However, instantaneous industrialization and urbanization have put immense pressure on our natural resources, As per India State of Forest Report 2021, forest cover is 21.71% of the country's geographical area (713,789 Sq km) and also the critical biodiversity hotspots like Indo-Burma region, Western Ghats and Sundarbans are facing threats from deforestation, climate change and pollution.

The environment has fulfilled all our needs with its resources and it is important that we use them prudently. By doing so not only can we protect nature but also conserve it for our future generations. A healthy environment not only increases life expectancy and promotes a healthier society but as an individual it also contributes to the development of moral and spiritual health which helps to address societal problems with clarity and efficiency, leading to the betterment of individuals as a whole and leading to better governance.

Realising the urgent need of conservation, the Government of India has launched several initiatives under the MoEFCC which is the nodal ministry to implement and monitor these policies like National Mission for a Green India, National Adaptation Fund for Climate Change, State Action Plan on Climate Change and National Biodiversity Action Plan. Targeted programs like Project Tiger, Project Elephant and Namami Gange are for species and habitat conservation. Other schemes like Faster Adoption and Manufacturing of Hybrid and Electric Vehicles Phase II (FAME-II), Extended Producer Responsibility for Plastic Waste Management and afforestation programs under CAMPA are to mitigate environmental degradation.

On a global scale, climate change is one of the pressing issues in the current scenario. In numerous summits, countries have come together to discuss the environment and to promote more initiatives like Montreal Protocol (1987) and Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) to decrease emissions and reduce pollution as a result of discussions on environmental protection. Several initiatives like the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC), Kyoto Protocol (1997), Paris Agreement (2015) and Conference of the Parties (COP) have been established by the United Nations to reduce carbon emissions and promote sustainability.

In the past the environment ruled and humans peacefully coexisted with it. However, the situation has seemed to change, and now humans are attempting to dominate the environment, which is becoming increasingly hazardous every day. The environment is our home which fulfils our needs so we should be treating it like one and not tormenting it.

Every small effort counts and the change starts with us. We don't need to wait for governments or corporations to lead the change. Everything we need is provided by nature so now, it's our turn to return the favour. Let's accept our responsibility, make thoughtful decisions, and make sure that the world is not just habitable for living but also thriving with beauty and life for future generations. We can ensure a brighter future for all living things and our beautiful environment by standing up today.

Progress at What Cost? Finding Our Lost Connection with Nature

We talk so much about progress — skyscrapers, bullet trains and infinite screens that glow

throughout the night. But behind all this brilliance, what is left of the Earth that held us first? The



streams that sang to our forefathers are now filled with waste. The woods that murmured us secrets are chopped into spreadsheet numbers. Nature does not cry out; it observes in stoic silence. The question is not whether we can master nature, but whether we comprehend the price of attempting it. Have we confused domination with progress and lost our roots?

Nature, in feudal India, was not just an assembly of land, water, or forests — it was sacred. Natural resources were personified as gods and goddesses, and rivers such as Yamuna, Ganga, and Kaveri were seen as divine. Monsoon rains, on their advent, were welcomed as a boon. Peepal trees stood tall witnessing the community gatherings, providing shade for panchayats and rituals, representing the symbiosis relationship between society and nature. But with the shift from feudal to capitalism, changes did not only come economically; it changed the very nature of how we saw nature. Forests were now just timber reserves, rivers water resources, and the land commodified as a source of revenue. Human's sacred and symbiotic relationship with nature slowly broke down, to be replaced by an exploitative one based on capitalistic profit. When the Chipko Movement began in the 1970s, it was not merely a protest against deforestation. When they hugged trees, the villagers were trying to revive the lost harmony with nature. Their uprising was a call for something greater — a call to restore the interdependence with nature.


Karl Marx described alienation as the separation of workers from the results of their labour. Today, in a capitalist society, this alienation goes beyond the factory walls— we are ever more disconnected from nature. Farm fields are controlled by monoculture crops, leeched of life through overuse of chemicals. Forests are cut down to pave the way for highways and industrial developments, disrupting ecosystems that once thrived there. Even rivers, which were once considered lifelines, are dammed and diverted in the name of development, their flow quantified and digitalised into data points on corporate spreadsheets. We tend to celebrate GDP growth as the ultimate measure of progress, but it does not reflect the real condition of our environment. The air we breathe, the health of our soil, and the strength of our ecosystems are all invisible in these limited digits and formulas. In a world governed by profit, the value of nature is not determined by its existence, but by its exploitation.

Mahatma Gandhi's vision of swaraj, or self-rule, extended beyond politics. It embraced a life in harmony with nature. His principle echoes Bhutan's Gross National Happiness Index, which values environmental well-being more than mere economic growth. Imagine an India where stock market surges do not measure success, but by the revival of wetlands, the return of sparrows, and the richness of the soil. Technology can serve this vision — solar panels bringing light to remote villages, and artificial intelligence predicting droughts without discarding the wisdom of traditional rainwater harvesting. True progress lies not in taking more, but in choosing less so that both nature and communities can flourish.

Sometimes, the most powerful act is to listen. Listen to the melting Himalayan glacier, the warmth of rice fields swaying in the dawn, or the koel's song at sunrise. In these sounds, nature offers a quiet invitation — to step away from the illusion of mastery and return to nature's rhythm. Poet Rabindranath Tagore writes in Geetanjali, 'The same stream of life that runs through my veins night and day runs through the world.' Can we learn to follow that stream? Can we be humble learners, and understand the language of roots, rivers, and rain? True wisdom does not come from certainty but from the courage to question. And the next time you stand in a forest, ask not what it can give you, but what you owe it.

18th October, 2024 : The outreach program included demonstration of microbiological techniques, lab facility visit and interaction with the students, research scholars and faculty of the department of microbiology.






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Tawarikh The History Departmental Society




SAMDRISHTI Report 2025




























































KALAPRAWAH 2025
