


### Timeless Bonds and Lasting Impact



After completing my Class XII in Vadodara, I enrolled in the B.Sc. (Hons) Microbiology course at RLA, Delhi University in 1997. Initially, I had doubts about whether I had chosen the right path. However, during the first year, with the guidance of dedicated faculty and the hands-on experience gained through intensive lab work, I gradually developed a deeper understanding and appreciation for the subject. By the end of the first year, my enthusiasm for microbiology had solidified. The academic environment and the personal and professional support provided by the faculty were crucial to the success of my studies. Throughout the three years, I performed well academically and was also part of the college soccer team, where we won a silver medal at the intra-RLA sports meet. The Microbiology Department at RLA not only offered excellent academic training but also ensured overall personal development. After finishing my undergraduate degree, I pursued an M.Biotech course at AIIMS, New Delhi, which eventually led me to undertake a Ph.D. jointly at AIIMS and IP University Delhi in cancer biology. My research journey took me to Sweden, where I spent 6.5 years—first as a postdoctoral researcher and then as junior faculty at the Translational Medicine Department of Lund University.

During my time in Sweden, I contributed to the development of a novel 'WNT5A mimicking' FOXY5 peptide, which is currently in Phase II clinical trials in Europe for the treatment of colon and breast cancers. In 2016, I returned to AIIMS, New Delhi, as a permanent faculty member in the Department of Medical Oncology. Currently, I lead the 'Cancer Metabolism & Therapeutics' lab, where I mentor postgraduate and Ph.D. students. Reflecting on my journey, I truly believe that the foundation I received at RLA was instrumental in shaping my future. The education, support, and opportunities I experienced there not only launched my career but also gave me the confidence and skills to make meaningful contributions to cancer research and treatment.







This shift in evaluation laid a foundation for academic adaptability, pushing us to focus on continuous assessment rather than one-time exams. Additionally, during the academic year of 2013, Delhi University introduced the Four-Year Undergraduate Program (FYUP), which was later scrapped in 2014. Despite the controversy surrounding FYUP, one significant advantage was the distribution of laptops, which provided practical exposure to essential software like MS Word and MS PowerPoint. This early exposure helped me develop vital skills in documentation, presentations, and digital literacy—skills that I continue to rely on in my legal career. The academic experience at RLA College was foundational in many ways. My focus on political science during my undergraduate studies gave me a deep understanding of governance, international relations, and Indian foreign policy. This subject not only sharpened my analytical thinking but also played a critical role in my decision to pursue a career in law. The debates and discussions in class enabled me to think critically and argue persuasively—key skills for my future profession. Additionally, the faculty's mentorship and their encouragement to apply theoretical concepts to real-world scenarios were invaluable in fostering my ability to approach issues from both practical and analytical perspectives.

Participating in research projects as an undergraduate, particularly getting the chance to present a paper at the Indian Institute of Public Administration, was a moment that made me believe in myself. Standing in front of seasoned academics, sharing my work—it felt surreal. The confidence it gave me shaped many of my future endeavour. Outside the classroom, RLAC was equally formative. The Statecraft Society, debates, discussions, and activities allowed me to sharpen my thoughts and arguments. Outbound learning experiences like visits to embassies and Ambedkar Memorial etc. enriched me in ways textbooks could never do. 


